Parents Support Group (PSG)

The Role of the PSG

The school is proud to have a 'Parent Support Group' (PSG) that is made up of a group of dedicated parents that volunteer their time in supporting teachers in the classroom, providing special events and activities for children, as well as creating an information and social network for parents. The efforts of the PSG are not solely directed towards the international community within the school but also in the enhancement of integration within the local community. The PSG is instrumental in the organization of activities designed to help raise funds for extra curricular activities not covered by the school fees.

Role of the Class Representative

The PSG also organizes a team of Class Parent Representatives that work with their assigned class group parents and teachers. These parents help recruit parents from that class for different activities, organize all communications to their parents from the PSG and sometimes from the teachers, collect funds for different events and manage the 'class fund'.

The Class Fund

The 'Class Fund' is a fee of **€15 per child for Group 1 to 7** that is requested from parents each year to fund its basic services. This fee is used to help fund extra class activities as well as to purchase extra items which an individual class may need. A fee of **€25 per child for Group 8** is requested from parents each year to fund its basic services as well as their Graduation Event at the end of the year.

Pizza

Children are offered pizza for lunch on Thursdays or Fridays (depending on the location). Pizza slices are ordered through the year class representative and coordinated by the PSG and delivered directly to the school at lunch time. Orders for pizza are made and paid for in advance by slice for each child. This is arranged through the PSG.

The PSG provides information to parents, usually circulated via the class representatives and on the school website. It is important that parents regularly check the school website for news and

Things to consider when you first arrive

Registration (*Burgerlijke Stand*)

Within three to five days of your arrival in The Netherlands, you are required to register with the local authorities (*gemeente*). This has to be done even if you live in temporary housing.

If you intend to reside in Hilversum, go to:

The office is open from 09:00 to 13:00, Monday to Friday and on Thursday evenings from 17:00 to 19:30.

Useful website: www.hilversum.nl . There is a section “Digitale Balie” where you can find information (in Dutch) for Verhuizing naar Hilversum.

To register you will need to bring:

- a valid passport
- a birth certificate
- marriage, divorce or registered partnership certificate
- an apostille from the local authorities of your last place of residence
- a rental contract or house purchase contract
- an employment contract

Official translations may be necessary for some papers.

Once you have registered with the Gemeente, within a few weeks you will receive registration documents and a Burgerservicenummer (see below).

Burgerservicenummer (BSN), a Citizens Service Number, which is a unique, personal number issued to everyone registered in the Personal Records database of a municipality. It is required by everyone including children to be in the health care system, open bank account or start a job. For further information, call BSN hotline tel: 088 - 900 1010

Driving in Holland

The most important rules for driving are:

- Drive on the **right**, overtake on the left
- 18 years is the legal minimum age to drive a **car** (or motorbike over 125cc)
- It is compulsory to **carry** a driving license, car registration papers and insurance documents in the car (see information below regarding foreign licenses)
- Mobile cellular **telephones** may *only* be used with a hands-free system while driving. Even holding a mobile in a moving vehicle is considered an offence
- **Seatbelts** are compulsory in the front and rear of the vehicle
- Children younger than 18 and shorter than 1.35m must sit in an approved **car seat** or raised, booster seat
- **Headlights** should be dipped in built-up areas but it is prohibited to use side-lights only
- Drivers should pay particular attention to **cyclists** who may ride two abreast
- Unless otherwise signposted, vehicles coming from the right have **priority**
- **Busses** have priority when pulling out
- **Trams** have priority except where signposted at major junctions

Children in cars

It is obligatory that children under 18 who are less than **1.35 metres tall** must travel in an EU approved child car seat or raised booster seat. This applies to travelling in the front and back seats. A child under three may not be transported in a without being strapped in to a seat.

Driving License

Once you have become a resident in the Netherlands, you can use your foreign license for a certain period. The length of this period of time depends on the country of the license. After the period of time has elapsed, you must obtain a Dutch driving license. Licenses from many countries can be exchanged for a Dutch driving license if you have a valid residence permit. See www.rijbewijs.nl/nl/english.asp for detailed information in English. If it is not possible to exchange your driving license, then you must take the standard theory and practical driving test.

Health

As soon as the family is registered at the Gemeente, relevant information is shared among the different government departments. One of them is the *Provinciale Eend administratie*, which is connected to the GGD (District Health Service) and is responsible for making sure that all children receive the required inoculations.

Parents are notified by the local District Health Services as to when they should take their child to be examined or inoculated. For most of the families in the school, this is done through Jeugdgezondheidszorg (JGZ), Youth Health care, which is part of the GGD. All children up to age 19 are monitored through the JGZ.

Young pre-school children aged 0-4 are checked and given vaccinations via the Consultatie Bureau. There are several around Hilversum and you will be assigned to the one closest to your home.

School age children aged 4-19 are monitored by the GGD through check-ups at about age 6 (group 2) and about age 11 (group 7). There are further vaccinations at age 9.

Health Insurance

General medical care is high in the Netherlands, but non-interventionist in nature. It is mandatory for everyone to have at least a basic level of health insurance (basisverzekering). However, you are free to choose your health insurer and the level of cover you wish to have. The standard basic package (basispakket) is much the same from all insurance providers, but costs may vary.

This standard insurance covers:

- Medical care, including general practitioner, hospital and specialist care
- Dental care (only until the age of 18)
- Medicines
- Ambulance services
- Midwife services and post natal mother and baby care

You will need extra cover for adult dental cover, optical care, physiotherapy or other areas of cover, which are considered to be your own responsibility. Some healthcare providers are registered with the insurance company directly and invoice directly, others will expect you to pay and claim back yourself. There is a compulsory excess paid each year, in 2017 it is €385.

The Family Doctor or *Huisarts*

The *huisarts* is the centre of your health care while you live in the Netherlands. Through your family doctor, you have access to all the services of the Dutch medical system. He is the focal point as he refers you to specialists, paramedics and hospitals. He also gets copies of reports from hospitals and specialists and thus keeps your medical history up to date.

It is important to find a *huisarts* near your home as they make house calls when necessary.

A few suggestions to get you started:

- Ask neighbours and friends for recommendations.
- Look in the yellow pages under *Artsen-Huisartsen*.
- Use www.huisartsen.nl, type in your postcode and a list of doctors nearby will come up.

You will need the *huisarts* assistance to:

- Call an ambulance for other than life-threatening emergencies.
- Be treated in the emergency room for other than life-threatening injuries.
- Be admitted into hospital for other than life-threatening situations.
- See a specialist.

At weekends or during the holidays when your doctor is unavailable, use the Huisartsenpost (see below).

If you or your child is sick in the evenings or weekend, but it is not an emergency, you can call the Huisartsenpost for an appointment. They are open every day from 5pm until 8am the following morning. At the weekends they are open from Friday 5pm until Monday 8am. They are also open on public holidays. At all other times, you should go to your normal doctor.

First you must call and make an appointment. You will be required to provide

- Details of your health insurance number
- The name of your family doctor
- Details of the medical problem
- Details of any medication being taken

Next to the Huisartsenpost, there is also a pharmacy, the Dienstapotheek open the same hours as the Huisartsenpost.

Specialists

Specialists are usually found in the *Polikliniek* (outpatient) section of the hospitals. To consult one, you need a referral letter from your *huisarts*, which he will give you only if, in his opinion, it is necessary that you see one. He will give you the name of the specialist to go to, but you still have the freedom to go to one of your own choosing. It is important to realise that your choice of specialist determines your choice of hospital as well. All the results and the progress of specialist treatment are recorded and sent to your *huisarts*.

Hospitals

Ponsplaatje

The first time you go to a hospital, you need to obtain an identity card, *ponsplaatje*.

This card contains information about you and your insurance coverage. You will have to take this along every time you go to the hospital for treatment. Please note that a different card is required for each hospital.

To obtain a ponsplaatje, you must provide:

- Your health insurance card
- Details of your family doctor
- Identification e.g. passport

Admission to hospital

Only a specialist can authorize hospitalization for treatment or surgery. Inform your insurance company immediately of the date of admittance to hospital. It is often best to go to the hospital nearest your home but you may be able to choose another one instead. Talk this over with your *huisarts*.

Emergency

There is an emergency room at both the above hospitals. For acute emergencies, **dial 112** for an ambulance. If you have a serious condition, which may require prompt attention, contact your family doctor immediately to be seen and referred if necessary to the hospital. If your doctor is not available, call the Huisartscentrale 0900-1515 until 5pm. If after 5pm, then call the Huisartsenpost (see above).

Pharmacy (*Apotheek*)

You may choose the pharmacy most convenient to you. Once registered, most prescribed medicine will be paid directly by your insurance company. Sometimes, you may have to pay a small fee. Should you need to fill your prescription in a pharmacy other than the one where you are registered, you may have to pay the full price. This can later be reimbursed by your insurance company.

Most *apotheken* (pharmacies) are open Monday to Friday from 08:30 to 17:30.

However, there are a few 24-hour pharmacies. A listing of late-night pharmacies can be found in your local *apotheek* or in a daily newspaper.

Houses and utilities

Finding accommodation

It is common to appoint a broker an estate agent (makelaar) to do much of the work: tracking down appropriate houses, arranging viewings, advising on negotiation and potential pitfalls. Another benefit might be that a makelaar knows which properties will come on the market shortly. The agent's commission will be 1-2% of the purchase price.

Utilities are often billed monthly at a fixed amount and then adjusted annually after the meters have been read.

Water

Tap water is drinkable throughout the Netherlands. The Regional water board (Waterschappen) is responsible for the management of water resources and households are charged a tax, levied by the local gemeente.

Household Garbage

Household garbage is collected regularly every week, alternating between “green”, “blue” and “grey” containers. The recycling varies from city to city. The collection schedule for your home can be found on www.gad.nl on ‘ophaalkalender’.

Click on “ophaalschema” then you need to type in your postcode and house number.

This should give you the schedule of collection for each type of household rubbish.

Green containers are for garden and organic waste.

Blue containers are for paper, cardboard and magazines.

Plastics are also separated in some cities and collected monthly in special plastic bags: You can find these bags in your supermarket and on www.zakkenbestellen.nl.

Glass, bottles and jars should be taken to bottle banks located around the city

Grey containers: for all other household refuse that cannot be recycled

Large items such as fridges or old furniture can be collected directly from your home. You must contact GAD and make an appointment. This can be done online via www.gad.nl or by telephone 035-699 1888

Batteries

There are containers in many shops and most supermarkets to put old batteries for recycling. The containers are marked ‘Lege batterijen’.

Deposits on Plastic Bottles and Beer

Drinks sold in plastic bottles, such as mineral water, coke, etc. and beer sold in glass bottles will usually be sold with a ‘statiegeld’. This is a deposit you are charged for on the bottles, which is refunded to you when you return the bottles for recycling. To get your refund, bring your bottles to the special bottle return places within the supermarkets.

Second hand shops

There are many second hand shops around Hilversum. If you wish to get rid of items from your home e.g. furniture, clothing, white goods, you can take it to the Kringloper.

Banking

The Netherlands has a modern banking system incorporating traditional neighbourhood banks, cash machines as well as internet banking services. The major banks include: ABN AMRO, ING Bank, Rabobank, Fortis and SNS.

Cash: Payment by cash is common but notes of €100 or €500 are often not accepted. Cash can be withdrawn at an ATM marked with sign "Geldautomaat".

Debit card (known as PIN): This is the most common form of payment and is widely accepted.

Chipknip: This method of payment requires your debit card. You transfer money from your bank account to the debit card, and then you can use it to pay for items, such as parking meters.

Credit cards: These are not widely accepted and identification is usually required, such as a driving licence. VISA and Mastercard are most likely to be accepted in large department stores.

Internet Banking Services: This is a simpler and more efficient method of dealing with your banking needs. Most banks have internet banking available in English. You can also authorize automatic payments for monthly bills.

Accept giro: Some companies will have an *Acceptgiro* attached to the bill. There is usually a charge to use them.

Cheques: Cheques are not used in the Netherlands for normal transactions. International cheques can be deposited in bank accounts, but there will be transaction fees.

The Post services are run by TNT and many post offices have closed. Postal services can now be found in some supermarkets, shops such as Bruna. Albert Heijn. See www.tntpost.nl to find post offices in your area.

OV- Chipkaart

The OV-chipkaart has been introduced in recent years for payment for public transport. There are many different kinds of card you can buy depending on the frequency you will use it. The card is the size of a credit card, which you preload with credit. Then the card must be 'swiped' as you enter and then leave the bus or tram. The fare is automatically calculated and deducted from your credit. OV cards can be loaded with credit at various points around the city, e.g. at Albert Heijn supermarket, in addition to machines at the station.

Pets

Dogs must be registered at the local town hall (gemeente) and an annual tax (hondenbelasting) has to be paid to the tax office (Belastingdienst). Cats and other pets do not require registration. Lost/found animals are usually taken to the local rescue centre (dierenasiel).

If you plan to leave your pet at a kennel (dierenpension) while you are on vacation, you must have a pet passport and keep vaccinations up-to-date. Kennels get booked up during school vacations, so it is advisable to book early.

There are good veterinary services available in all towns (dierenarts). There is always a veterinary practice open for emergencies at night and at weekends. If you have an emergency outside normal practice hours, then call your vet and a recorded message will give you the telephone number of which vet is available.

Shopping

The centre of Hilversum has many of the chain stores, seen all over the Netherlands, such as Hema, C&A, Intertoys and Perry Sport. There is a large indoor shopping centre called the Hilvertshof, which has many shops for clothes, food and also has a car park on top.

Gijsbrecht van Amstelstraat in Hilversum: this is a street near the school, which has many interesting and good quality individually owned stores. There is an excellent bakery, butcher, toy, clothing and shoe shops. Beware of the parking wardens, who are quick to give out parking fines.

Many other towns in 't Gooi offer good shopping, such as Bussum, Naarden, Laren and also Utrecht, Amersfoort and Amsterdam offer excellent shopping and a wider range of shops.

Shops are generally not open on Sundays in Holland, although Amsterdam and Den Haag are exceptions. In some bigger cities, there is a designated *koopzondag* (Sunday shopping). Many shops also stay closed on Mondays or do not open until 1pm. Each town has its own late shopping night, *koopavond*, usually Thursday or Friday.

Cultural traditions in the Netherlands



Oud en Nieuw (New Year's Day)

Midnight, December 31

The Dutch welcome the New Year with a bang! Fireworks can be bought in specified locations all over the country and are allowed to be lit for a few hours only for this day of the year. Traditional pastries such as *oliebollen* (a round doughnut-type pastry) are served throughout the day with champagne, coffee or tea.

Carnaval

Carnival is a Christian festival held on the Tuesday before Lent. It is a chance for people to enjoy themselves before Lent begins. In the Southern part of Holland, especially in the city of Maastricht, this is a major event with carnival parades complete with floats, marching bands, and costumed participants. Carnival in Rio with a Dutch flavor!

Kings Day (Koningsdag) April 27

This is a national holiday in the Netherlands, the Netherlands Antilles, and Aruba on 27th of April or on 26th of April if the 27th is a Sunday. Kings Day celebrates the birthday of the King of the Netherlands and is supposed to be a day of national unity.



Kings Day is known for its "freemarket" (*vrijmarkt*) all over the country, where everybody is allowed to sell things in the streets.

Other activities during Kings Day are children's games, individual musical performances, and music concerts. The night before Kings Day is called Kings Night (*Koningsnacht*) and is marked with celebrations especially in the city of Amsterdam and The Hague.

Orange is the colour of the day - the colours of the royal family, the House of Orange-Nassau. Most homes and public buildings will display their national flag and the orange flag on this day.



Memorial Day (Doden herdenking) May 4

Remembrance of the Dead is held annually in the Netherlands. It commemorates all civilians and members of the armed forces of the Kingdom of the Netherlands who have died in wars or peacekeeping missions since the outbreak of World War II.

Traditionally, the main ceremonies are observed in Amsterdam at the national monument on Dam Square. This ceremony is usually attended by members of the cabinet and the royal family, military leaders, representatives of the resistance movement and other social groups. At 20:00, 3 minutes of silence are observed throughout the country.

Liberation Day (Bevrijdingsdag) May 5

Liberation Day is the celebration of the liberation of the Dutch people from German occupation. This is often accompanied by fanfares, markets and fireworks in the evening

Avondvierdaagse

This is a Dutch early summer tradition in which many schools and other organisations participate. It involves 4 organised walks, along specified routes around town on four consecutive evenings in May or June.

Prinsjesdag

The 3rd Tuesday of September sees the State opening of parliament. The King rides in a golden coach through Den Haag.

Sint-Maarten, November 11.

Celebrated in traditionally Catholic villages, this feast is marked by the making of lanterns and a procession around the village ending at the Church where a Mass is held to commemorate the kindness of a soldier-saint. Much like Halloween, the children go around the neighbourhood in the early evening with their lanterns and time-honoured St. Martin songs. They are rewarded with candies and fruits.



Sinterklaas , December 5th. A tradition very dear to the Dutch. It is celebrated throughout the country with parades and big festivities. *Sinterklaas* celebrates the feast day of Bishop Nicholas of Myrna who was made a saint about 1000 years ago. He is the patron saint of children and this is his feast day.

Sinterklaas and his assistants, the *zwarte Piet*, arrive in the Netherlands in mid-November and there are big festivities in each town to watch them arrive.

From the date of his arrival until Sinterklaas leaves (Dec 6th) children leave their shoes by the fireplace each night and hope for some goodies to be there in the morning. The celebrations on December 5th are usually a very private family affair. There are special decorations, poems, songs and food served on this occasion.

IPS Hilversum Parking Advice

Our school locations are situated in a busy residential neighbourhood, which is not designed for the benefit of school traffic. Furthermore, we are not the only schools in the area, so pick up and drop off times are very congested. **You will need to build a little extra time into your routine to allow for finding parking space and walking to school with your children.**

To help you find efficient and easy local parking space we have put together the following map. The green lines indicate permitted parking, however be aware that there are many residential access drives along the roads, which reduce the actual space available.



- Rembrandtlaan locatio
- Drop off zone at Rembrandtlaan
- Frans Halslaan locatio
- 30 spaces at hotel

Due to concerns for children’s safety in and around the approach to Frans Halslaan , Rembrandtlaan and Minckelerstraat, the school has adopted the following protocol. In choosing to send your child/children to the IPS Hilversum you are expected to conform to this traffic protocol.

Please note that the traffic situation is constantly under review. Each year, the School Guide provides updated information and any developments during the course of the school year can be followed in the school Bulletins.

We recommend the following for the Rembrandt, Mondrian and Frans Hals Location:

- 1) Arrive a few minutes early and park in the first space you find. The closer you drive to the school gates the more chance you will get stuck in traffic. There is usually space on Pieter de Hooglaan and further up the Frans Halslaan towards Vermeerlaan and beyond.
- 2) Lapershoek Hotel overflow car park. (See map, bottom right hand corner) Guaranteed space only 2 minutes walk from Frans Halslaan, 5 minutes from Rembrandtlaan. Permission has been given by the hotel.
- 3) Frans Halslaan is not wide enough for two way traffic, which causes big problems between Van der Helstlaan and Utrechtseweg. **Avoid this section** and approach from one of the other roads (not Utrechtseweg)

Please consider the following restrictions:

- Double parking and/or resting two wheels on the pavement is illegal. It is dangerous for the children (as it restricts visibility) and restricts the movement of traffic. **Please don't do this.**
- You should not block a residential exit, even temporarily, as the residents need free access to their homes at all times.
- You may not park alongside the red striped bollards or where there are yellow marks on the pavement. These restrictions are placed there for safety reasons and you will risk a parking ticket.
- The ISH (International School) car park is for the use of the parents and children of that school, it is separate from the IPS Hilversum.
- The car park at Frans Halslaan should not be used during pick up and drop off times. (see FAQ below).

The recommendations for parking at **the Mondrian location** will be shared with you at the beginning of the school year 2017-2018. We are still in consultation with the City Council.

Car Parking at Frans Hals location – Frans Halslaan FAQs

What are the parking restrictions on Frans Halslaan? When and where do they apply?



This sign indicates **No Parking** on the designated side of Frans Halslaan. A second red diagonal forms a cross on this blue and red sign to indicate **No Stopping** between two crossed signs during school drop off and collection times, from 8-9 am and 14.15 – 15.15. Yellow markings on the pavement indicate an adjacent parking restriction, as do bollards with a red stripe. These are effective at all times.

Who is entitled to use the car park in front of the school playground?

Officially the car park is owned by the gemeente (local council). However, the separate section to the left belongs to Traktion and is for the exclusive use of office personnel and official visitors to that business.

Why can't I use the car park? – other people do!

Due to the safety concerns we have for our children, we have made it school protocol not to use this car park **at drop off and pick up times**. The lane is too narrow for cars to pass in and out at busy times, and there is a risk that children arriving on bikes, scooters, or simply walking may get injured. We ask you to respect this request.

The exception to this request is the Violen school IPS teachers, who arrive before the children do. You will also see cars bringing children to the Nijntje crèche, which is a separate organisation. They are usually also arriving before our busy time.

Why are some people being allowed to drive into the car park when children are arriving in the morning– this is dangerous!

Yes it is! We cannot fully restrict usage of the car park as it is a public space. There will be cars arriving for work at the neighboring office and dropping children at the crèche. We have however, requested they take the school start and drop off times into consideration when arriving. We have also placed a staff member on duty at the entrance to help control the flow of cars entering the car park. We all need to be vigilant and follow the school guidelines to ensure that children arrive and leave school safely.

Why can't I just pull up on the sidewalk to let my children out?

Children are arriving at school using these sidewalks; you are endangering their lives and inconveniencing them. Congestion immediately builds up when cars double park, restricting the clear line of sight for cars and bicycles at this busy junction, thereby increasing the risk of an accident. Doors opening onto the sidewalk present a hazard to pavement traffic. We have had several near - miss incidents and some accidents with our children because of this unsafe parking practice.

Please consider this very real danger, and build an extra few minutes into your schedule to allow for parking and walking into school.

Can I use the car park at the International School Hilversum (AT school)?

No, this car park is exclusively for the use of the ISH staff and parents.


